The Rolex Rankings number 113, established two months prior to this event, will be used for the invitation of athletes.

According to the Invitation System for the Global Champions Tour (GCT) approved by the FEI Bureau in November 2007

- 60% of the athletes will consist of the athletes 1 to 30 on the Rolex Rankings two months prior to the event. In case of athletes declining invitations replacements will be selected from the Rolex Rankings in descending order. Athletes in this group cannot be lower on the Rolex Rankings than 150th place. Requirements obliging organising committees to invite at least two athletes from each NF are to be relaxed;

- 10% of the participants will be home athletes and will be selected from the top 150 athletes on the Rolex Rankings. Also included in this group is the FEI Wild Card. The home athletes are selected by the home National Federation and the FEI Wild Card by the FEI. Should the Organising Committee (OC) not be able to meet its quota of home athletes in this group, the quota will be filled by inviting additional athletes from 60% group in descending order as described above;
- 30% of the participants are selected by the OC. It is not obligatory that these participants be chosen from the Rolex Rankings;
- The FEI will apply a certain amount of flexibility in relation to enforcing the rule obliging OCs to have at least 10 NFs represented.

Young Horses

The young horses competitions (6- and 7-years old) are open for the athletes of CSI5* and CSI2*.

The young horses (6- and 7-year old) may start in other classes as from the age of 7 years old in CSI5* and 6 years old in the CSI2*.

However, once they have started in a class other than the ones for young horse, they cannot go back to the young horses classes. And otherwise, once a horse has started in the classes for young horses, it cannot go back to the other classes).

Athletes are invited by the Organising Committee through their NF.

2. GROOMS

Any groom wishing to remain within the FEI stable area during the night may do so only with the authorization of the Chief Steward.

The Person Responsible must ensure that his/her grooms, and/or other authorised person(s) with access to his/her horses, are familiar with the security and stewarding procedures.

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the OC.

The OC offers breakfast and 1 meal per day to the grooms on the show grounds on 13, 14 & 15/08/2010.

3. HORSES

No transport expenses will be paid by the OC.

Horses must be stabled in the boxes assigned to them on the show ground

Horses may not be unloaded on their arrival without the authorization of the Stable Manager and Veterinary Delegate.

Stables must be mucked out daily and dirty bedding and rubbish placed in the special containers. At the stable area there are separated waste bins for glass, paper, plastic and dung. Please hand the rubbish in the indicated bins. It is absolutely forbidden to hand the rubbish in the straw or shaving container. A penalty of EUR 250 will be charged when these rules are not followed per transgression.

Boxes which are ordered and not used, must be paid if they are not be cancelled up to 2 weeks before the first day of the tournament.

The bedding for horses is free of charge. Feed can be bought within the stable area at current prices.

Straw and shavings must be ordered before 1:00 p.m. for the same day delivery.

The stables will be ready from Thursday, August 12th to Monday, August 16th, 2010 – 12.00 h. If stabling is required outside this period please contact the OC.

For events in Europe, stabling is free of charge.

Outside Europe, stabling to be paid by OC or Athlete at _____ per stable.

The OC may charge a manure disposal fee of max. EUR 40.-/horse/event.

4. ADDITIONAL FEES

All further fees (i.e electricity, etc.) must be listed hereunder with the details of the amounts to be charged. These must have received FEI Approval before being included in the published schedule. **Only fees approved by the FEI and listed in the approved schedule can be charged by the OC.**

For the health papers the competitors will be charged 35€ per horse.

Only 1 electricity connection (16A/220V) per lorry will be offered for free. Extra electricity connections will be charged for 50€ per connection. There will be no 380V connections available.

3. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

Except for the GCT Grand Prix, the 6 best riders of each class must take part in the prize giving ceremony on the horse they started in the corresponding competition (exception are only possible with the approval of the Ground Jury and the OC).

Bridle according to Art. 260. On order of the OC the riders must immediately assemble for the prize giving ceremony. No prize money will be paid to a rider who does not take part in the prize giving ceremony and/or Press Conferences without being excused by the Ground Jury and the OC.

For the prize-giving ceremony of the GCT Grand Prix and the Press Conference, the riders are obliged to follow carefully the instructions of the OC. Only the 3 best riders of the Grand Prix are invited for the prize giving ceremony. After the prize giving ceremony the 3 best riders have to go immediately to the Press Conference.

The owner of the winning horse is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix.

4. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

All payments will be made according to Netherlands law and tax regulations. Competitors will be asked to provide all necessary information (Passport & Sofi-number), in order to guarantee a correct tax procedure.

According to the agreement with the IJRC and GCT, 5 % of the prize money will be deducted for the OC.

5. INSURANCES

All owners, athletes, trainers, private veterinarians and their accompaniments are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees/grooms, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

"The Organising Committee and its commissioners will NOT be responsible for any damage caused by competitors, their horses, owners, NF officials, their employees/grooms or their representatives."

11. STARTING ORDER AND TIME TABLE

The entries for the next days competitions must be made in the show office 60 minutes after the end of the last competition each day at the latest. For the competitions of the first day the entries must be made at the show office before the end of the horse inspection!

Horses can participate at maximum 1 competition per day !

The Organising Committee has the right to make changes in the time tables providing the Ground Jury gives its approval.

12. EVENT'S ORGANISATION (Art. 114 - 115)

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping Department by the Foreign Judge.

13. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Athletes wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These athletes will start first in these competitions.

14. TRAINING AREAS WITH PRACTICE OBSTACLES

are on the show grounds at the competitors disposal. No riding is allowed outside the dimensions of the training areas: Schooling hours on the paddock's are allowed following a time table established by the Chief Steward.

15. CANCELLATION OF THE EVENT

If special circumstances demand, the Organising Committee reserves the right to take all necessary action including the cancellation of the event, with the approval of the FEI.

16. STABLE SECURITY

The following security regulations of the fire department must be obeyed:

- Smoking is strictly prohibited in the entire stable area.
- Open fires (ex. camping stoves) are strictly prohibited.
- Only the actually needed amount of feed supplies may be stored in the stables.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**
