For the CSI2*, and this in accordance with the Special Regulations for international Competitions of the Dutch NF (KNHS), at least 7 athletes of the total number of competitors will be home athletes appointed by the home National Federation.

For CSI1* only according to the special invitation.

The young horses (6- and 7-year olds) may start in other classes. However, once they have started in a class other than the ones for young horses, they cannot go back to the young horses classes. And otherwise, once a horse has started in the classes for young horses, it cannot go back to the other classes).

2. GROOMS

Cost of accommodation and meals will be at the cost of the athlete. Requests for accommodation must be sent with entries.

Any groom wishing to remain within the FEI stable area during the night may do so only with the authorization of the Chief Steward.

The Person Responsible must ensure that his/her grooms, and/or other authorised person(s) with access to his/her horses, are familiar with the security and stewarding procedures.

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the OC.

OCs must provide sufficient sanitary and showering facilities, with hot and cold water for male and female grooms. These must be regularly maintained in a proper state of cleanliness.

3. HORSES

Transport expenses to be paid by:

Horses must be stabled in the boxes assigned to them on the show ground

Horses may not be unloaded on their arrival without the authorization of the Stable Manager and Veterinary Delegate.

Stables must be mucked out daily and dirty bedding and rubbish placed in the special containers. At the stable area there are separated waste bins for glass, paper, plastic and dung. Please hand the rubbish in the indicated bins. It is absolutely forbidden to hand the rubbish in the straw or shaving container. A penalty of € 250 will be charged when these rules are not followed per transgression.

As stabling is limited, basically there are no tack boxes nor stable boxes available for horses that do not compete in the CSI Valkenswaard. However, if the Organizing Committee approves in advance a tack box or the stabling of an extra

horse, an amount of € 150,00 per horse will be charged for each horse not competing in the CSI Valkenswaard. Requests for extra boxes must be sent with the definite entries.

Boxes which are ordered and not used, must be paid if they are not be cancelled up to 2 weeks before the first day of the tournament.

The first bedding for horses is free of charge. Feed and bedding can be bought within the stable area at current prices.

Straw and shavings must be ordered before 1:00 p.m. for the same day delivery and will be put on the expense note.

The stables will be ready from Thursday, August 12th to Monday, August 16th, 2010 12.00 h. If stabling is required outside this period please contact the OC.

For events in Europe, stabling is free of charge.

4. ADDITIONAL FEES

All further fees (i.e electricity, etc.) must be listed hereunder with the details of the amounts to be charged. These must have received FEI Approval before being included in the published schedule. **Only fees approved by the FEI and listed in the approved schedule can be charged by the OC.**

Only 1 electricity connection (16A/220V) per lorry will be offered for free. Extra electricity connections will be charged for 50€ per connection. There will be no 380V connections available.

the prize giving ceremony without being excused by the Ground Jury. The owner of the winning grand prix horse will be invited to the prize giving ceremony.

4. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

Full details of any deductions from prize money must be outlined in the schedule. This includes government taxes. If it is necessary for OCs to deduct such taxes, they must provide participants with an official form indicating the amount of tax deducted. All payments will be made according to Netherlands law and tax regulations. Competitors will be asked to provide all necessary information (Passport & Sofi-number), in order to guarantee a correct tax procedure.

5. INSURANCES

11. STARTING ORDER AND TIME TABLE

The entries for the next days competitions must be made in the show office 60 minutes after the end of the last competition each day at the latest. For the competitions of the first day the entries must be made at the show office before the end of the horse inspection!

Horses can participate at maximum 1 competition per day !

The starting order for the competitions will be as follows:

First competition - special draw

Second and following competitions - rotation

The Organising Committee has the right to make changes in the time tables providing the Ground Jury gives its approval.

12. EVENT'S ORGANISATION (Art. 114 - 115)

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping Department by the Foreign Judge.

13. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Athletes wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These athletes will start first in these competitions.

14. TRAINING AREAS WITH PRACTICE OBSTACLES

15. CANCELLATION OF THE EVENT (Art. 115.1 and 2)

16. STABLE SECURITY

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**
